- Opening Prayer by PTO President, Nicole Samson, at 8:04 a.m.
- Introduction of PTO Board Members and Rachel Jones (Development Director)
- Two School Fundraisers: Pepperoni Roll Sale and Walk-A-Thon (Rachel):
- Buy-out option for fundraisers went out via email in August. If you received the pepperoni roll sale email, you did not sign up for the buy-out option. It's not too late to choose the buy-out option. Contact Rachel if interested in buy-out.
- Friday, Sept. 15, will be the last day to turn in pepperoni roll orders. The following Friday, Sept. 22, the pepperoni rolls can be picked up beginning at noon. The location of the pick-up will be determined in the near future.
- Walk-A-Thon will be held in the spring. Families can still participate in this event even if you chose the buy-out option. Information regarding date, time, and location of Walk-A-Thon will be circulated to all families closer to the event date in April.

- Committee Reports (Nicole)
- Homeroom Parents are responsible for organizing three classroom parties. Each classroom will receive $\$ 50.00$ per party. Be sure to ask your respective teacher if they allow extra parents to assist on party days.

- Snacks are provided and delivered by the PTO.
- Can combine classes for the parties. (Example: The two 1st grade classrooms could combine their funds for a total of $\$ 100$ and use both rooms for the party. One room could have arts and crafts, for example, and a different activity in the other room.)

- Volunteers to wear Spirit Gear so they are easily identifiable by grandparents
- Krispy Kreme being checked into as a possible option for donuts and coffee at the event
- Trunk or Treat (Friday, October 20):
- Format: There will be a certain time frame wherein those who wish to decorate their car and hand out candy will be able to get into the upper parking lot in order to park car and decorate it. Then, that lot will eventually be closed so no more cars have access to that area for safety reasons. Participants who are not decorating a car and are only "trunk-or-treating" can park in the lower lot and walk to the top.

- Checking into whether the lights can be turned on at the playground area so as not to be as dark as it has been in the past
- Parent/Community Party:
- Will have a new format
- Will only be held every five (5) years

- January- Event will be held at the end of the month prior to Catholic Schools Weeks
- February- Service Work Event
- March- No activity
- April- Middle School formal
- Location will be decided upon in the near future
- Edge- Youth Ministry Program will be held one time per month. First meeting is Sept 29, 2023, in the pavilion. This is a faith-based organization that includes hanging out with friends, fun activities, and learning about and deepening relationships with God.
- Reminder: these are parent-run events; not school sponsored.
- SCRIP (Stacy Downey):
- When Covid occurred, SCRIP went completely online. There is now an abbreviated SCRIP book back in the office with some physical gift cards for purchase.
- If a new family has no account, reach out to Stacy for help in setting up an account. Can't provide an enrollment code as that has led to fraud in the past.
- Every $10^{\text {th }}$ of the month, Stacy places an order for physical gift cards. These usually arrive at the school a few days later, on approximately the $15^{\text {th }}$ of the month.
- Remember, you are buying SCRIP gift cards in order for your student(s) to dress down the following month. (i.e. buy $\$ 100$ in SCRIP gift cards in September, then your child(ren) can dress down in October).
- There is a hard deadline to purchase for the month. That is, you must purchase $\$ 100$ worth of SCRIP gift cards by 11:59 p.m. on the last day of the month. (i.e., must purchase $\$ 100$ of SCRIP gift cards by 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2023, in order for your child(ren) to be eligible to dress down in October).
- In order to qualify for dress down in August of a new school year, you must purchase a total of $\$ 100$ in SCRIP gift cards anytime from May 1 July 31.
- Examples of SCRIP gift cards that are available in the office: Walmart, Sheetz, Giant Eagle, Sweet Frog, Sonic, McDonald's, and others
- This is a great fundraiser for the school!
